Dorothy Day Tampa, Inc. - officially a 501 c3 nonprofit!

Progress Report: We received our IRS 501c3 nonprofit status June 6th. On May 21st, twenty Dorothy Day Tampa volunteers participated in a cosmetic refresh of Gracepoint's Coffee Shop homeless drop-in center as our first team building exercise. For most of the volunteers, this was their first opportunity to see first-hand what our planned drop-in center would look like.

On May 31st, Mayor Jane Castor and her homelessness team toured the center, interfaced with guests, and over lunch, heard



details of our vision to replicate the best practices of the Coffee Shop and another homeless drop-in center, 35-year-old Peace House Community in Minneapolis. Our team presented our five-year development plan outline that starts in 2023 with a single homeless drop-in center. The grand vision would replicate the \$100 million St. Paul, MN Dorothy Day Place that started with a single hospitality house in in 1981.

Next steps? We concluded our tour and lunch by requesting the help of the mayor's team in finding and securing a startup location for our ministry. We are grateful for Gracepoint hosting our event and the mayor's interest and willingness to help transform our vision into reality.

Ann's Reflection: Seeking Abundance in Others.

- o Have you ever made or fixed something for others?
- o If you could snap your figures and do anything what would it be?
- O What gifts do people say you have?

These sound like typical questions for ice-breaking exercises asked at conferences and retreats – part of getting to know the personalities and gifts present in the group.

What if I told you these questions are actually part of a homeless shelter survey?

Rather than the typical inquiries – "When was the last time you worked?" "Are you sober?" "Do you have a history of mental illness?" – that sadly are too often the only ones asked of people seeking help, one homeless shelter asked these questions to discover their guests' skills and passions.

Dorothy Day instinctively looked for the gifts of others and used those gifts in her mission. When everyone is invited to use their gifts, they become part of the community they seek.

Seeking abundance in all people is also a step toward humility and our own transformation. Mutually sharing our gifts with others—marveling at all they are instead of trying to fix them—gives our guests the best chance for transformation. It certainly can bring them hope and kinship.

Fr. Greg Boyle states, based on his experience with gang members: "Be in awe in all they bring you, not in judgement of how they bring it."
